Report on BC Council AGM, May 14/15, 2021.

The BC Council AGM was held virtually this year on May 14/15, 2021. I attended as our club's president and voting representative.

On Friday, May 14, the opening event in the morning was a presentation from Michele Novakowski, consultant in "Ending Violence in BC" Association and former executive director of the Central Okanagan Elizabeth Fry Society. Michele spoke on

'Our Role in Reducing Violence Against Women in Today's World'. Michelle also spoke of the importance of the work done by communities, organizations and intergovernmental services in reducing violence against women.

In the afternoon a second speaker, Carla Huber, director of communications and Indigenous relations for M'akola Housing Society presented "Indigenous Relations - How Not to Tick the Boxes".

In the evening, from 6:30 h - 7:30 h, a virtual meet and greet and social was held. This was a wonderful event and an opportunity to 'meet' other members across BC, as we shared our experiences during the past year.

On Saturday, May 15, the business meeting was held virtually. The BC Council theme for the past year was 'Perseverance'. The executive reports and club reports showed how well clubs have managed to persevere and rise to the challenges of the covid pandemic. Bylaws and resolutions were presented and voted upon. Two BC resolutions were presented and accepted, topic 'Kinship Care Programs in BC', and topic 'Restore and Update Seniors' Home Care Services'.

An announcement was made about next year's BC Council AGM and plans to meet in Kelowna, May 13-15, 2022. The event will be held at the Coast Capri Hotel in Kelowna.

This shows great promise of an event to reconnect with our fellow BC club members, if we are safely able to meet in the spring.

Report on CFUW National AGM, June 25/26, 2021

The National AGM was held virtually this year on June 25, and June 26.

I attended as our club's president and voting representative. Holding the event on two days enabled the separation of voting on resolutions from voting on bylaw and articles. - 3. Canada's Opioid Crisis.. -Montreal Lakeshore University Women's Club
- 4. **Post-Pandemic Recovery for Women in Canada and Abroad** CFUW International Relations Committee

At our face to face AGM's, there are many opportunities for networking and professional learning. In keeping with this, a total of 18 workshops were given leading up to the AGM. A virtual finance workshop

regarding CFUW finances was held on June 19.

Other virtual workshops included:

- 1. International relations panel presentation
- 2. Technology workshop
- 3. International advocacy workshop (with focus on what clubs are doing)
- 4. Reading financial statements and this year's budget
- 5. Indigenous peoples workshop

All workshops can be viewed on the CFUW National website. In the president's report 'Year at a Glance', it is impressive to see how much has happened during this pandemic year: 14 National webinars with 1535 registrants, weekly newsletters, a new website, 6 townhalls, continued international work with international partners, and more. A full report can be seen on the National website.

Normally, at the time of the AGM, an invitation is issued for the following year's AGM. If all goes according to plan, next year will be an in-person get-together. A host has not been arranged yet, but we will be updated as the plans unfold. It is hoped that a hybrid model may be possible next year, recognizing how many more people may be able to attend an online vs an in-person meeting.

I hope many of our club members will join next year, either in person, or virtually, this very rewarding opportunity to meet with members from across Canada.
