LOOKING BACK IN THE ARCHIVES HOW WE CELEBRATED OUR 50TH ANNIVERSARY IN 2009

In Feb, 2008, an ad hoc Jubilee committee was formed with the purpose of organizing events and displays to showcase the 50th Anniversary of the club, and involve the members and public to participate in the celebrations. We were fortunate to have Elizabeth Bordeaux as the Chair of this Committee working with Helen Christiansen, Gwen Arnold, Lorraine Ellenwood, Patricia Jahnke, Lois Hunter, Marion Setterlund, Mary Ann Rainer, and Marion

Reaburn to organize the events. The goals of the committee were: to collect funds for one or more Jubilee bursaries; to raise the profile of the club in the community; to write a historical record of the club's first fifty years; to have a gala Jubilee party; and to put on a public event for the enjoyment of the community.

Some of the highlights of the Jubilee Year Celebrations:

A Jubilee Luncheon was held on May 30, 2009 at the Hazelmere Golf & Country Club with over 80 members and visitors attending. The Stitch 'n Chat interest group produced 85 jubilee tote bags in colours of orange and shocking pink. Limericks were written and read by the Writer's Potpourri interest group. The Birds of a Feather interest group sang songs and there was entertainment by the Taylore Fox singers and a guest harpist. Margaret Long produced stunning floral arrangements for all the tables. Long time members were presented with 40, 45, and 50 year membership certificates.



- ◆ Posters were designed to inform the public of the scope of our activities and provide information to potential members. These posters were used in displays at our local libraries, the White Rock & Surrey Museums, Kwantlen, and at other events. Photos were selected from the club archives.
- A historical booklet, "Celebrating Fifty Years 1959 -2009" to document the 50 year history of the club, was printed with input from the members and our archival collection. The design of the inside and outside covers was provided by Monica von Kursell. Local sponsors were obtained to cover printing costs.



- An application was made to CFUW National for a 50th Anniversary Certificate which was formally presented at the Jubilee Luncheon on May 30, 2009 to club President, Rosemary Zelinka, by BC Council President, Susan Murphy.
- ◆ A Power Point historical review of over 200 photos from our archives was presented at the Jubilee Luncheon.
- ◆ A proclamation declaring June 18th, 2009 as CFUW White Rock/Surrey Day in our communities was granted by both,

White Rock Mayor Ferguson and Surrey Mayor Diane Watts.

- ◆ On October 2nd, 2009, the Elektra Women's Choir presented a concert at the Wheelhouse Theatre with over 200 in attendance. A highlight was when a choir member told the audience she was a former CFUW White Rock/Surrey Bursary recipient.
- ◆ The "Toonie" campaign for bursaries raised \$6500. The Tuesday bridge group donated over \$200 and of the 70 other donors, 40 gave \$100 or more.
- ◆ Great publicity was garnered locally including a full-page article in the Peace Arch News on our club and an article in the Surrey Arts Council Magazine about our Jubilee Year.

The 50th Anniversary was a resounding success due to great planning and the huge involvement of the club members who worked on many aspects of the celebrations.
