PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"The times are urgent, so let us slow down" Bayo Acomolafe

I'm very happy to welcome March, that this year seems to have come in like a lion, but hopefully with the lamb to soon follow. On my neighbourhood walks, as I see signs of spring with crocuses and dew drops starting to bloom, I feel hopeful for new beginnings after two years of alternating 'hibernation' during Covid. Finally, we are able to plan for safe gatherings once again, as we take each step forward at our own pace.

As we move forward with cautious optimism, I am reminded of this quote from the nigerian born author *Bayo Acomolafe*: *"The times are urgent, so let us slow down."* Perhaps, during our current turbulent times, this apparent contradiction

has global relevance. *Akomulafe*, philosopher, writer, activist, professor of psychology and executive director of the 'Emergence Network', describes that slowing down is not 'losing our way', but an invitation for us to listen deeply.

The practice of 'mindfulness' helps us to slow down in order to listen deeply and pay attention to the present moment. For many years, I have practised mindfulness exercises (with lapses in frequency – but good intentions) and also taught mindfulness in the workplace and in the classroom. Mindful practice reminds us to pay attention, to be kind to others, and to be kind to ourselves.

Recently, I tried the simple technique of 'neurographic painting' as a mindfulness exercise. The result was, that I had focused my mind for an hour, created a colourful piece of art and felt very relaxed! If you would like to give this technique a try, all you need is a piece of paper, a black marker, and some colourful pencils or paints. I found the following <u>voutube video</u> a good guide

Now is the time of year clocks 'spring forward', as will ours! I wish you many 'mindful moments' to enjoy life in the coming months, as we move slowly and mindfully forward into the future.

March 26th Program: GETTING READY – HEALTHY AGING

This month, our program is brought to us by our club advocacy committee, which is led by Anne Low. Anne and her 6 committee members have arranged to have a discussion on senior's issues and ageing. Our guest speakers will be Isobel Mackenzie, the Provincial Advocate for Seniors, and Gordon Hogg, past holder of many public offices in Surrey and White Rock,

The purpose of this special meeting with guest experts is to include the members of CFUW Surrey/White Rock more fully in the CFUW national policy regarding long term care and the Canada Health Act. The advocacy committee was asked by the club in 2020/21 to take on this topic fuelled by the COVID pandemic. The committee took on a letter-writing campaign to federal cabinet ministers, the prime minister and MPs and MLAs from Surrey, White Rock and Langley, and educated themselves by attending several webinars, interviews and other research.

Isobel Mackenzie and Gordon Hogg, through a series of discussion questions, will bring focus to what is available as we age. Isobel Mackenzie will be asked to speak about programs and resources at the provincial level, and Gordon Hogg to speak about community resources.

This promises to be an informative and lively discussion that you won't want to miss!

OPTIONS COMMUNITY SERVICES

On Saturday, Feb 26, we had the pleasure of learning about a non-profit organization, 'Options Community Services', that has existed for 50 years.

Ginny Hasselfield, director of development, Tammy Dyer, deputy executive director, and Noemy Rados, program assistant manager and youth worker, spoke to us via zoom of the many contributions that 'Options Community Services' has made to Surrey, Delta, White Rock, and Langley.

Ginny Hasselfield told us about the campaign to raise approximately 1.5 Million dollars. Fifty women from the South Fraser community were asked to fundraise \$25,000 each. This money contributed to the building of much-needed housing at King George Boulevard and 81st Ave. 'Options Community Services' is now planning to raise another 1.5 million dollars to have as a contingency fund to cover the needs of so many people in our communities.

Tammy Dyer and Noemy Rodos discussed with great passion, enthusiasm, and dedication their vision to inspire hope and belonging for all. 'Options' is a very diverse organization, united in the purpose of helping those in need. There are 80 programs, including crisis lines, counseling services, youth shelters, and housing for lower income families. Support is now given to youth up to 26 years of age. Ageing out of care has been problematic for years and now 'Options' can assist these youths to get life skills, develop a sense of belonging, and learn how to navigate the many opportunities that are available to them.

One example of the care that is provided to the youth is Sunday dinner. Dinner is provided on a regular basis to those who need companionship, a sense of family, and a good meal.

Navigating the mental health service is very difficult. Youth are taught how to begin seeking help and are guided through the process. There are just 10 spots for people needing mental health support, but 'Options' is working on increasing this number.

We could feel the enthusiastic and compassionate care that is being provided by staff and the 300 volunteers to help so many people learn to become independent and provide for themselves!
